VIII. Discussion and possible vote on replacement of the middle school pickup shade structure.

A. Brad apprised the board about pricing for a metal building which is running \$120,000.00.

- B. Another avenue is to ensure that a different tent meets the requirements for the shade structure and if a new structure meets all of the criteria and if so they will purchase a new tent that has all of the paperwork and they can get a permit for.
- C. The board is waiting on more information about the permit requirements and will continue the conversation at the next board meeting.

IX. Executive Director's Report.

A. Operations

1. Update on the 3-5 grade playground- Rob let us know that the playground company is slowing going. Their initial idea was way over budget and it was denied. Rob requested that they scale the ideas back to meet the budget.

B. Instruction/Assessment

 Update on CMAS scores- Across the board IACS did well with slight gains in Literacy. We did see a dip in mathematics which was not on our radar. We are already evaluating the disaggregated data which is showing us that we have a huge population of students who are approaching, meaning they were only a few points from met. This means with targeted support these scores should be a quick rebound.

C. Community Outreach

- Asset Management is working with IACS on a fall advisory challenge and is inviting other professionals to compete against one another in the competition as well.

C.R.S. 24-6-402 (4) The members of a local public body subject to this part 4, upon the announcement by the local public body to the public of the topic for discussion in the executive session, including specific citation to the provision of this subsection (4) authorizing the body to meet in an executive session and identification of the particular matter to be discussed in as much detail as possible without compromising the purpose for which the executive session is authorized, and the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the quorum present, after such announcement, may hold an executive session only at a regular or special meeting and for the sole purpose of considering any of the following matters; except that no adoption of any proposed policy, position, resolution, rule, regulation, or formal action, except the review, approval, and amendment of the minutes of an executive session recorded pursuant to subparagraph (II) of paragraph (d.5) of subsection (2) of this section, shall occur at any executive session that is not open to the public.
